What do good adventure stories have...

- A likeable main character – in this story that person will be you or someone from your house (Monday)
- A good plot – in this story you are going to discover a hidden piece of treasure (Tuesday)
- A really good setting – in this story you will find your hidden piece of treasure in an old abandoned castle (Wednesday)
- Some really good action – during your adventure into the castle there are going to be lots of problems you will need to solve before you find the treasure – this will help create tension and suspense (Thursday)
- Either a happy ending or a cliff hanger ending – we will talk more about this later in the week (Friday)

- Capital letters and full stops
