Changes to classes and rooms

You will be aware of a number of changes which have already taken place in school and there are more coming soon. I am pleased to say that from Monday 4th November, we are switching back to single age group classes and moving a number of classes around to better use the space available to us in school. The children found out about these changes in assembly this afternoon. Details are below-

Our nursery class is moving into Epping to be closer to our reception children and to ensure that our staff team are closer together and working more effectively together by sharing their expertise without the need to move between different buildings. The staff who currently work in these two classes will remain as they are.

Year 1 and 2 will stay in the rooms they are currently and be taught by their current teachers. Mrs Abdulla will become a full time member of this team and work with Miss Onions and Mrs Simpson will join Miss Jarvis to support Year 2. Mrs Bonney is moving to year 5 to support Mr Elliot and his group.

Year 3 and 4 will stay in their current building but Year 4 will move into Wykham while Year 3 will use Gisburn. Year 3 will be taught by Mrs Metcalfe and Mrs Dunkley. Year 4 will be taught by Mrs Hanhan and Mrs Jordan. These classes will be support by Mrs Balloch and Mrs Dunckly as they currently are. Miss Stott will continue to work in this team as she currently does.

Year 5 will be taught by Mr Elliot and support by Mrs Bonney. They are moving to Fleet.

Year 6 will be taught by Mrs Thompson and Mrs Williams and support by Miss Hetherington. This class are moving to Gosford. This will allow us to effectively shut off the classrooms at the top floor of the school and enable Year 6 to have their own 'wing' of the school.

We are also moving the staffroom to Stowe as this is more central for all staff, and is brighter and bigger. The old staffroom is going to become a room we can use for intervention teaching or breakout space.

As we grow the school again, we can begin to use some of the rooms we have shut down, but for now, having everyone close to a 'central hub' will be helpful.

Changes to the school curriculum

We have developed a curriculum working party who are meeting on Tuesday 15th October to work on the new whole school curriculum. We will have all the plans in place and be ready to launch this from January; Year 5 and Year 6 are trialling a model topic next term and we will learn lots from how that goes. The new curriculum will be published on the website along with the topic maps for each class for the year. At the heart of the new curriculum will be the whole class teaching of reading, writing and vocabulary. Each topic will be driven by high quality children's literature and linked to a broader topic such as The Ancient Egyptians, The Shang Dynasty of ancient China and The Great Rainforest, to give a few examples. There will be a completely new curriculum policy and a host of school trips mapped across the year for the children to look forward to. This is a big job and we are working as quickly as we can; we know that your children only get one shot at school but I want to ensure that they get the best curriculum we can give them and by spending a few extra weeks making sure it is properly planned, mapped out and that skills, knowledge and vocabulary are carefully planned to ensure they are progressive, we will make sure your children get the best to life they can get. Thank you for your support and cooperation with this.

Year 6 admissions to secondary school – a message from NCC

Parents / carers of pupils in year 6 who are due to transfer to secondary school in September 2020 are reminded that the closing date for applications is 5pm on 31st October 2019. If you have not already done so, please ensure that you apply for a secondary school place for your child and that this is received before the closing date. A late application will mean that the chance of getting one of your preferred schools is greatly reduced.

School places are not automatically allocated to any child even if there is an older brother or sister attending a secondary school or you live in an area linked to a particular school.

Closing date: For secondary school applications – 31st October 2019 at 5pm
